During the 2023-2024 season, we were thrilled to be able to award 1,155 tickets to students and educators from 18 schools in 8 central Ohio counties totaling more than \$41,000 in subsidies.

Thanks to the generous and ongoing support from our Broadway in Columbus season subscribers, we make the experience of Broadway available to the next generation of theatre goers in central Ohio.

Open to all public, private, and charter schools, this program provides subsidized tickets to help educators use the power of Broadway to serve as a tool to enhance their curriculum and make learning fun.

Heritage Month. With a growing immigrant and refugee community in Columbus, Yuyi



Morales' story is an important one to tell.

Born in Mexico, Morales moved to the United States in 1994. During her first years living in San Francisco, she says she remembers that she had no job, no friends, and barely spoke a few words in English. She was sad because she missed her native country and her family, and she often felt like an outsider.

One day, she visited a public library and was amazed and inspired by the section of children's books. Morales learned English by reading children's books to her son, Kelly, and felt so inspired by the vivid colors and illustrations from the books that

she bought a set of paints and brushes and enrolled in an extension class at UC Berkeley on writing for children where she met a group of other aspiring authors and illustrators.

Morales has since been recognized as one of the most celebrated Latina children's book authors using her family's legacy and heritage as inspiration.

Dreamers, a physically poetic adaptation of her story, celebrates the resilience and courage it takes to find one's voice when navigating a new place and encourages young people to use their own special gifts to build a better future.
