Everyone has a story to share



ARISE (ARts through Intergenerational Social Engagement), a collaboration between CAPA, GrowIN, The Ohio State University, and Worthington Christian Village is a 5-week intergenerational program focused on storytelling through the fine arts.

Participants in this program will include high school students from central Ohio, undergraduate volunteers from The Ohio State University, and the residents living on the Health Care Center and assisted living floors of Worthington Christian Village. Sessions will explore different ways to tell and share stories including activities centered around visual arts, music, dance and movement, and drama.

Goals of the program are to change age-based perceptions, to promote volunteerism, to find commonality and shared experience, to decrease loneliness, to strengthen communication skills, and to increase quality of life.

This year, we piloted this new program with students from two classes at Columbus Alternative High School.

An extension of the APPLAUSE Program, Broadway in the Classroom uses the power of Broadway to serve as a tool to enhance curriculum and introduce Broadway to the next generation.

It provides Title 1 schools with the opportunity to engage in six weeks of show-related curriculum developed by their teacher and CAPA and aligned with Ohio Department of Education standards. At the end of the six weeks, students attend a Broadway show, share their final projects, and have the chance to connect with cast and crew members from the tour.

For the pilot program, teaching artists, Amy Handra, Emily

Kirtland, and Julie Whitney-Scott made weekly visits to Columbus Alternative High School in December and January and worked with students on curriculum centered around the musical, SIX. The main themes explored were selfempowerment and taking charge of the narrative of your own story.

On January 27, students travelled to the Ohio Theatre for a pre-show reception, a performance of SIX, and a post-show talkback with the cast and production team.

After the success of the pilot program, we plan to launch this as a yearly school program.
