is an interactive living history play with music that shares the untold story of James Herman Banning and Thomas Cox Allen, the first African Americans to fly across the United States.

We wanted to share this story with our community because it's one that is not well known, has strong central Ohio ties, and because this story of two extraordinary aviators who broke down barriers is one that we knew would inspire.

community. First, we travelled North to Worthington Christian Village for a performance for their residents.

Then, we stopped by the South side and performed at the Reeb Center for an audience that included youth from The Boys and Girls Club of central Ohio.

Next, we went to West High School where a group of students rehearsed and performed the musical number alongside the cast during a performance for the entire school.

Finally, we made our way to the Lincoln Theatre for a community day which included a pre-show paper airplane flying contest with prizes, a performance of the show, and a talkback with the cast.

Finding North

On February 6–26, we will present a free virtual engagement of Finding North. Originally commissioned by the National Underground Railroad Freedom Center in Cincinnati, and drawn from historical research, this dynamic production brings to life the powerful story of John P. Parker, a former enslaved man who helped fugitive enslaved people escape through the Underground Railroad in southern Ohio. Parker's tale is beautifully woven together with contemporary stories of others searching for haven in modern-day America.

Registration for this free engagement will open on CBUSArts in January.



CAPA in Schools

This fall, we worked with the fourth-grade class at Graham Elementary & Middle School on their Humanities unit, Poetry and Becoming Writers.
